Web Site Updates



Sleuthing with Maps

There are historical aerial photos of Plymouth area from 1930's up to the 2000's and you can view as hybrid maps with current streets and roads overlaid. The following is an example of finding out what was located on a site in Plymouth. It was rumored that Plymouth had a race track south of Bass Lake but it had to have been very short lived. In checking a 1971 aerial photo the track shows up clearly but it wasn't there in the 1960's maps or 1980's. It was turned into a housing development.



The so called race track shows up clearly when you zoom in on this 1971 aerial photo just south of the CN Railroad tracks. The north/south street is now Larch Lane and the street just north of the railroad tracks going to the east is 53rd Ave N. 

Another example is this 1937 aerial photo. Hwy 101 is running north/south on right side of picture with the Minn Western Railroad (Luce Line) crossing right north of where Gleason Lake School is today and across Hwy 101 is the electrical substation.

The Blodgett Dairy was located where the electrical substation is today on the west side of Hwy 101. The Blodgett Dairy burned in 1947 and the area was subdivided for homes and the substation built. The area west of Hwy 101 and south of the Luce Line tracks was in Plymouth until the early 50's when it was annexed by Wayzata. We haven't had time to explore Plymouth's Township records to verify; but suspect it had a big influence on Plymouth changing from a Township to a Village in 1955. We will have more in the future about other "Gentleman Farms" that were located in Plymouth and are long forgotten.

A New Look

The City of Plymouth has replaced all the windows in the "The Old Town Hall" where the Plymouth Historical Society calls home. No more drafts and snow drifting in when the winds howled. The replacements matched the old windows and if a person didn't look closely you wouldn't know they had been replaced.

Meetings


