We have had displays of artifacts in all the schools and the local banks and they were very warmly received. The children attain more knowledge of our history through these. We welcome our young people's help and ideas.

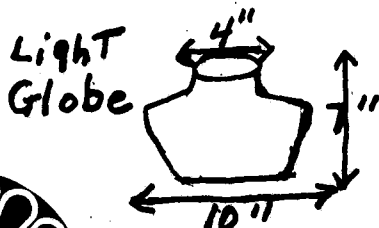
We have had good response from some of our business people but we need your help also. We urge you to attend our meetings held the 4th Wednesday of each month at the new city hall.
