Copy of letter from Belle Libby Smith - written by Judge John Day Smith.

"This is a chart John Day Smith (no relative) drew for Isabelle Day Libby.

"I have drawn up a little chart showing our descent from our common ancestor, Thomas Day, Jr., born at Ipswich, Mass. in 1677 and died at that place in 1750. Your great grandfather, Jeremiah Day was also born in Ipswich, Mass. in 1713 and died there in 1785. Your grandfather, Aaron Day, born in Ipswich, date unknown. I am descended from Aaron Day, my great grandfather, and Mary or Polly Day. My grandmother, who was born in Ipswich in 1773 and died in 1857.

"Your grandfather's brother, John Day, married my grandmother's sister, Sarah, as you will see by the chart. John Day, brother of your grandfather Aaron was born in Ipswich Mar. 4, 1751 and was married in Ipswich Dec. 22, 1774 to Sarah Day, daughter of Aaron Day who was born in Ipswich Nov. 2, 1751. They went to Maine and settled in Winthrop.

"All of our ancestors sprung from Ipswich.

He married Marion Harris who died March 17, 1852. Their son Nathaniel Day was born Nov. 30, 1807. He married Boobar on Dec. 5, 1830 at Kilmarnook, Maine. Of this union there were 12 children the youngest being my mother Sarah who was born June 9, 1851 at Milo Maine. She was married to Edward Hughes Nov. 26, 1872. There were 8 children as follows;

Aaron, born in Ipswich and married there, but we have no record of whom he married or size of family. He had a son, Aaron, born in 1784, died in 1862. He married Marian Harris, who died Mar. 17, 1852.

Their son, Nathaniel Day, born Nov. 13, 1807, married Eunice Boobar Dec. 5, 1830 at Kilmarnock, Maine. Of this union there were 12 children. Of these, Joseph Warren, born July 22, 1849, was our grandfather Day.

In the year 1874 in the month of April he was married to Miss Ellen Truax. They are the parents of three children of whom the eldest passed away before the father, leaving them two, a son and a daughter. He has always been a kind and loving father to his family. He was taken sick in the month of April last, and from that time until he passed away he was a great sufferer. In all of that time he never complained of his suffering. He has been a resident of Pine County for the past few years, going there for his health.

He was a man that was beloved by his neighbors and friends and leaves no enemies. At his death he was 70 years, six months and ten days old.

Mrs. Sarah Hughes Feted on Her Birthday

Nearly 50 relatives attended the family reunion of the Hughes family at the A.J. Eastman home in Plymouth township Sunday in honor of Mrs. Sarah Day Hughes' eighty-fifth birthday anniversary. Mrs. Hughes born in Milo, Maine, June 9, 1851, came to Minnesota with her family when she was fourteen years old. An interesting feature is that she came on the same train that bore the assassinated Abraham Lincoln's body back to Illinois.

On Nov. 28, 1871, she was married to Edward Charles Hughes. Five of their eighth children are still living and were present at the birthday party.

Four of her brothers enlisted from Maine, and Amos and Frank from Minnesota. Amos was starved to death in confederate prison at Andersonville.

Those present at the observance Sunday included her children, grandchildren, and great grandchildren. Five children, George of Aitkin, Minn., Edward, of Minneapolis, Mrs. Edna Scott, Robbinsdale, Hugh and Mrs. A.J. Eastman (Eunice) both of Plymouth, were at the reunion. Others included:

Mr. and Mrs. Lester Hughes and children of Aitkin, Arthur Hughes of Wayzata; Mr. and Mrs. C.H. Loomis, Mrs. La Jenness and 2 children, and Miss Margaret Carr, all of Mpls.; Mrs. Sarah Cruikshank and children, Mr. and Mrs. Wilrose Begin and son; Mrs. Cora Peterson and Clifford Amen, all of Wayzata.
