Pine Cone Santa Claus

Make a tag board basket to put on his back, add small trinkets if there is room. Put a belt around the waist of dry moss, and wrap a scrap of wool around the neck for a scarf. and beard. Cutting out mitten shapes can make the hands. Make a small cap. hands on-wooden beads work well for the head, just add the features and wool or flax for the hair boots with a pointy top, and stick them into the ends of the cone used for legs.
